FIXTURES SECRETARY & ACCESS REPORT 2021/22

Overall it has been an active year for the club. As well as the usual programme of Thurdsay evening events we have hosted 2 major events, the Compasssport Cup heat at Hawse End in February and day 2 of the Lakes 5 Day at Threlkeld in August. In view of the workload presented by these we decided to hold only 3 Cumbrian Galoppen events in 2022.

The following table summarises our fixtures and participation for September 2021 to August 2022. There is only 1 galoppen event because the 2021 galoppens were early in the year whereas 2 of the 2022 galoppens have still to take place.
