Mapping Report 2023

Scope of mapping

Over the years we have mapped a huge area of 'West Cumberland' – see attached *Map of Maps*. As reported last year, there is such a lot that we can't maintain it all, so we have to be selective in updating the areas most important to our fixtures lists. Help is always welcome for updating maps.

Tree Disease

Ash dieback seems to be progressing ever faster. It hasn't yet affected our access to areas, but it will in the future as large trees die and become dangerous. Felling affected trees has its own hazards, and some land managers may prefer just to keep people away.

We aren't currently losing any more areas to larch disease (Phytopthora ramorum) but it's still around.

Software

As last year, the use of Open Orienteering Mapper (for making and maintaining maps) and Purple Pen (for course planning) is spreading through the club, as recommended by the committee. Both apps are currently free, and provide an easier alternative to the versions of OCAD that many of us use.

OOM is currently at version 0.9.5, and incorporates some improvements requested by us. It may go to a paid version at version 1.0 (no date yet) so get your free version while you can!

Event Areas

We had a difficult period in spring and early summer when a number of events were under threat. Restrictions were placed upon us in Wythop Woods at short notice. Big efforts by Ian Teasdale and Steve Breeze got a much reduced event away. The Dalegarth Galoppen was in serious doubt when one of the National Trust tenants withdrew permission. Sterling work by Roger Thomas and Richard & Ann Cummings rescued that event. A training event in Powter How was cancelled because of nesting birds. Rannerdale Knotts permission was declined because of increased traffic in the Buttermere valley in the bluebell season.

Partly as a result of these problems, Liz Elliott initiated a series of meetings with all the National Trust Rangers involved in our areas. Mike Hind and I joined in for the relevant ones. These were very positive meetings and resulted in clear agreements on some areas with access restrictions. They also volunteered two new areas, which we are assessing (Dunthwaite near Isel and Low Wood at Wasdale)

External Maps

We had no requests for maps from Fell Race organisers or other bodies this year.

Permanent courses

Whinlatter:

Ongoing. We do not have anyone looking after these courses. There are likely to be changes needed after the major felling due early 2024

Bowness Knott:

Courses are still closed. Felling is complete, but some remapping is required. The forestry work has left the forest floor in a poor state; we decided that this is not a suitable area to take the general public into. New, paths-based, courses will be explored.

Bleach Green:

Ongoing. Signs of use, but only two recorded attempts on iOrienteering.

Updated the Hensingham map for an evening event


Mike Pearson:

A new map of Egremont was created, and used for an evening event. It was well received, and will now be revised and extended.





Map Low Wood, south of the Wasdale YHA (Jon Eaton/Pete Nelson). Anyone got any YHA contacts?


