Mapping Report 2024

In the last year we've issued no new major maps, but there's been a lot of work ongoing in updating and extending existing maps. We're lucky to have so much terrain, and the competent mappers to look after the most important bits.

Scope of mapping

Over the years we have mapped a huge area of 'West Cumberland' – see attached *Map of Maps*. (also issued separately at higher resolution). As reported last year, there is such a lot that we can't maintain it all, so we have to be selective in updating the areas most important to our fixtures lists. Help is always welcome for updating maps.

Tree Disease

Ash dieback continues to affect our area, with many large trees now affected. Some landowners (particularly the National Trust) are felling trees where the public may be vulnerable Felling affected trees has its own hazards, and some land managers may prefer just to keep people away. As far as I know, we haven't lost any access yetfor this reason .

Felling due to larch disesase (Phytopthora ramorum) is affecting us a little in Whinlatter, and will do in Ennerdale, but there are currently no new big areas under threat.

Software

Jon Eaton has arranged for two club licences for the latest version of OCAD. The initial purchase is for three years. Any two nominated people can use it at once. So far, seven people have been given access. The main benefits are in processing LIDAR data and in checking readability of maps against IOF guidelines (e.g. not having black symbols too close together.

Open Orienteering Mapper (for making and maintaining maps) is still the preferred option for some of our mappers. It is currently at version 0.9.5, and incorporates some improvements requested by us. It may go to a paid version at version 1.0 (no date yet) so get your free version while you can!


Purple Pen remains our preferred course planning tool.

Event Areas

We have had extensive discussion about the use of the Stony Tarn/Eel Tarn area. This area is of limited suitability for evening events, because not many people are prepared to travel. There is a usable field for Galoppen-sized events. It's an ideal area for a major event, but vehicle access, parking and assembly would have to be sorted before we made a commitment. A grant was sought for commercial mapping, but failed. Base map prepared from LiDAR; no fieldwork will be done unless there's a real prospect of using it.



Mike Pearson has provided his work so far of Armboth Fell, some of which was used for an evening event. The long term aim is to join Harrop Tarn to Bleaberry Fell.



External Bodies

We had no requests for maps from Fell Race organisers or other bodies this year. EUOC requested Honister Coombe, but it was not then used.

Borderliners sought our agreement to them mapping Keswick (Threlkeld) Golf Course. This map is now complete.


Permanent courses

Whinlatter:

Whinlatter suggested an update of the permanent courses there. Charlie Rennie will liaise with Rob Jones (Forestry England/WCOC) to create the courses when a small area of larch felling is complete.

Bowness Knott:

The map has been updated, and new courses created and installed. The 'technical courses were heavily constrained by the condition of the forest floor. There is a lot of challenging 'brash on boulderfield' terrain which is not suitable for a public course. One checkpoint has been removed by persons unknown, and replaced. There are signs of use at some checkpoints, but few people record their run on iOrienteering – 3 on the easy course and 2 on the short technical. There has been little interest from club members.



Bleach Green:

Ongoing. The northern part of the wood is due to be closed this winter for forestry work. It is hoped that this will not affect the courses. Only one person has recorded their run on iOrienteering this year.



Michael Billinghurst:


Kept an eye on the continued felling and windblow in Setmurthy.

Prepared a new map of Richmond Hill School (Aspatria) for the schools' league




Mike Pearson:

Has expressed an interest in participating in club mapping. We're currently looking at suitable areas.


Pete:

Took over Armboth Fell from Mike Pearson, though I'm unlikely to do any actual mapping. Volunteers welcome.


Walkmill Community Woodlands (Moresby) updated after phase I of the Rivers Trust work was completed. We hope to use it for a night event this winter (late 2024).




Finished the extension to Hunter How, to include the complex (and now notorious) bog.

Map of Egremont Castle Prepared to Schools' standard




A special enlarged version of the Blindcrake map was prepared for the Saturday Series.


