Parking: Level grassy field with track access, please have £2 per vehicle ready

Assembly: Adjacent to the parking field, toilet provided.

Dogs: Dogs on leads in assembly and not allowed on the courses.

Terrain: Rough pasture and open fellsides, generally very runnable with some areas of

heather and gorse. Longer courses have a short section in a mature conifer

plantation. In some areas there are more complex sections of depressions and spoil

heaps from 19th century iron ore workings

Special symbols: These symbols are used on the map. There are no controls on

them.

O = Mine entrance. These are sometimes fenced, especially in the wooded area, but

please exercise care in all cases.

X = Post

Safety: A whistle must be carried by all competitors. As it's October and you could be 500m

ASL on an exposed fellside, cagoules and a warm hat may be compulsory. Please bring these to the event and be prepared to wear or carry them. There will be a sign in Assembly indicating if they are compulsory. Full leg cover is not mandatory but

consider the weather on the day.

Start times: 1030-1200, punching starts

Course Close: 1430

Start: Approximately 1km with 50m of ascent from Assembly, allow 15 minutes

Finish: Adjacent to Assembly

Courses: Mandatory crossing points will be marked on the map and the control descriptions.

**Short Green**: Has a small amount of steep uneven descent and contouring. People with dodgy ankles or who use a walking aid may prefer the Very Short Green which is

gentler.
