



Event News

The weekend saw many top British orienteers heading to the South Lakes for three events organised by WAROC which may or may not be part of the UK Elite Orienteering League. Saturday was a double-header, with a middle event at Thwaite Head, and a night event at Bishop Wood, with Sunday a long event at Blind Lane. The events had an interesting format with men and women running the same courses.

There was much Club interest. In the men's race, Alastair Thomas had strong runs in both Saturday events. In the middle Will Gardner took the win, in 29:49; with Alastair only 14 seconds behind in 2nd and finishing in exactly the same time as top-ranked Graham Gristwood and in the night event Graham took the win in 31:42, with Alastair 2nd, less than a minute behind .

Joe Hudd also showed his dominance in M18, finishing 13th in the middle distance but first M18 in 33: 31 (over 4 minutes ahead of the 2nd placed M18) and in the night event, he finished an impressive 7th overall.

In the women's race Niamh Hunter had steady runs to finish 5th woman in the middle race (32nd overall) and in the night event, she was 8th woman (38th overall). At the time of writing results for the Sunday event are not available. Full results can be found on the UK Elite Orienteering League website.

Mapping News from Pete Nelson

Open Orienteering Mapper have once again listened to our experience, and made improvements. Versions 0.9.3 and 0.9.4 already have upgrades requested by us, to improve the way the program works with OCAD files, and with OS Grid coordinates. I've been struggling for a while with certain .tif files used as templates (background maps). It took me months to pin down the problem. It took them two days to solve it, and five days to issue a new version for testing. For
