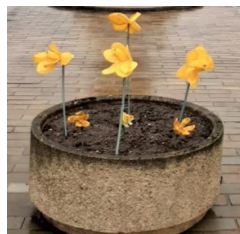


Welcome to more new members— Jim, Bee and Scarlet Masters and Sarah Blundell. Looking forward to meeting you all at the upcoming events.
