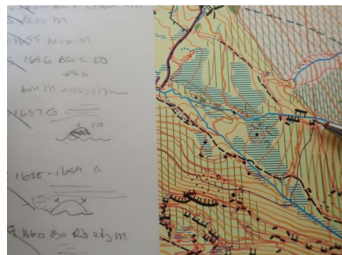

Provisionally Saturday 3rd July, all outside. We can vary the date, time, and contents to suit you.

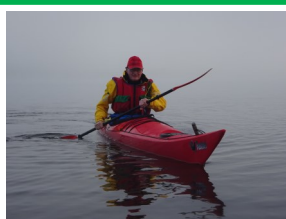
