There was also Club interest in the Elite races, with the EUOC Legendesses, including Niamh Hunter on 2nd leg finishing 2nd, and in the men's race, the EUOC Legend's team, including Alastair Thomas on 3rd leg, taking 3rd place.

The WCOCtonauts team of George Rennie, Sola Holmes and Eva Humphreys ran really well on the Junior Relay just missing out on the podium in 4th, and there were two 6th places, one on the Intermediate Men's course, with the team of Isaac Hunter, Toby Heppell and Dan Heppell, and the other for the Senior Men's team of Jamie Rennie, Alan Irving and Simon Hunter.



WCOC - Training and development opportunities (From Scott)

In addition to the ongoing training, development and coaching opportunities that take place within the club there are a variety of external training courses available to club members over the coming months. These courses are open to all adult members though there may be limits on numbers due to availability. Outdoor Emergency First Aid

A 16 hour, practical, scenario based course designed as an introduction to first aid in an outdoor or remote environment. The course is run by the British Association of Ski Patrollers (BASP) over 2 days in Brampton (near Penrith). This course is ideal for club coaches to keep their first aid qualification up to date. It is also ideal for any club member who is active outdoors and regularly comes to events. As a club we need a good number of members with relevant first aid training to ensure the safety of our events. The course is recognised by a long list of NGBs in the UK — so it may prove useful beyond orienteering.
