Some reminders - it will be dark so you will need a decent headtorch , and the weather will be getting colder so please make sure you dress appropriately for the conditions and you are advised to carry a whistle. You are likely to be a bit slower in the dark so choose your course carefully to ensure you are back before the courses close. The events before Christmas tend to be on easier areas so are suitable for those new to night orienteering or those with limited experience. The events after Christmas tend to be in more technically challenging areas so may not be suitable for novices. (Some weeks there may be a Night Hawk course which will usually be on paths but a bit longer than the usual novice course). Check the details on the WCOC website and seek advice if you are unsure whether an event is suitable for you.
