The remainder of the top ten was made up of Isaac Hunter 4th, Chris Naylor 5th, Steve Holmes 6th, Daisy Rennie 7th (1st lady), Simon Woodbury 8th, Mike Harrison 9th and Alexander Reed 10th. Eva Humphreys was 2nd lady.

On the 1.7km Short course, George Rennie was 1st in 13:47, Simon Farrell (IND) was 2nd in 15:58 and Sue Skinner was 3rd (1st lady) in 17:08. The rest of the top ten was Kevin Hodgson 4th, Mille McLoughlin 5th, Bob Barnby 6th, Malcolm Ruckledge 7th, Jenny Benson 8th, Helen Edmondson (IND) 9th and Penny Kingsland 10th.

It was good to see a good number on the Novice course this week. Matthew Farrell (IND) took the win in 15:29, with Russell Hardy 2nd in 16:02 and Lily Hardy 3rd in 16:04. Our juniors gave strong performances to come 2nd overall, an exceptional result considering that there were several classes with no Cockermouth runners. The overall winners were High Storrs, from Sheffield, with 16 points, whereas Cockermouth had 21 points, putting them well ahead of the team in 3rd, The

Perse Upper School, with 65 points.



In the Girls' competition, there were no entries for years 7-9, and 11. In the Girls' Year 10 class, Myrtle Ashworth took the win, Sophie Crawford was 2nd, Eva Humphreys was 5th, and Mille McLoughlin was 7th.
