

West Cumberland Orienteering Club Week 9 26 02 2023

High Doat - Thank you to Bob Barnby for the finale of the night event series. On the night, on the 4.3km Long course, Joe Sunley took the win in 36:55, with Dan Heppell 2nd in 38:09, and Steve Birkinshaw 3rd in 39:48. The rest of the top ten was made up of Jamie Rennie 4th, Simon Hunter 5th, Toby Heppell 6th, Emma Crawford 7th (1st lady), David Spencer 8th, Chris Swanepoel 9th and Ian Cumpstey (JOK) 10th. Daisy Rennie was 2nd lady and Karen Parker (BL) was 3rd lady.

On the 2.6km Short course Lily Charkson took the win in 40:50, with Roger Thomas 2nd in 42:22, and George Rennie 3rd in 42:34. The rest of the top ten was made up of Jeff Goodwin 4th, Sue Skinner 5th, Katy Boreham (IND) 6th, Hannah Birkinshaw 7th, Roger Jackson 8th, Andrew Bell (BL) 9th, and Ian Teasdale 10th, and on the novice course Jim Morris took the win, with Sam Morris (IND) 2nd, and Julie Ferris-Worth (BL) was 3rd.

Being the last event of the night series, the final overall standings were decided - thanks again to Pete Nelson for collating the points and producing the overall league. On the Long course, Jamie Rennie took the win, managing to fight off the challenge from Dan Heppell in 2nd. Mike Harrison was 3rd, Isaac Hunter 4th, Toby Heppell 5th, Emma Crawford 6th (1st lady), Daisy Rennie 7th (2nd lady), Ian Cumpstey 8th, Ruben Razzetti 9th and Alan Irving 10th. Karen Parker was 3rd lady.

On the Short, Sophie Crawford (with an impressive 7 wins in the series) took top spot, with Roger Thomas in 2nd, and Roger Jackson 3rd. The remainder of the top ten were George Rennie in 4th, Bob Barnby 5th, Sue Skinner 6th (2nd lady), Lily Clarkson 7th (3rd lady), Kevin Hodgson 8th, Helen Rennie 9th and Katy Boreham 10th.

On the Novice course, it was the battle of the Holmes' siblings, with Hiroki just taking the win from sister Sola in 2nd. Kyra Holmes was 3rd, Emily Brookes 4th, Chris Brookes 5th, Wilf Clarkson 6th, Beatrix Gorrill 7th. Millie McLoughlin 8th, Isabelle Crellin 9th and Jessica Crellin 10th.


M20, and Ruben Razzetti on M18. Other Club members earned podium places. Charlie Rennie
