The rest of the top ten was made up of Ruben Razzetti 4th, Dan Heppell 5th, Jamie Rennie 6th, David Wilson 7th, Emma Crawford 8th (1st lady), Emma Stuart (BL) 9th (2nd lady), and Wilf Teasdale 10th. Daisy Rennie was 3rd lady.

On the 2km Short course, Lily Clarkson took the win in 18:56, with Susan Skinner 2nd in 20:10 and Ian Teasdale 3rd in 20:13. The reast of the top ten was made up of Jim Morris (IND) 4th, Sam Morris (IND) 5th, Janette McHendry 6th, Michael Pearson 7th, Flora Ballester (IND) 8th, Roger Jackson 9th, and George Rennie 10th. On the novice course, Wilf Clarkson took the win, with Cerys Naylor 2nd and Jessica Crellin 3rd. Isabelle Crellin was 4th, Anne Stockley 5th, and Sola Holmes and Kyra Green were joint 6th.

5th July - Biketreks, Keswick


12th July - Inn at the Bush, Kirkbride


## **British Sprint and Middle Distance Championships Weekend**

A small but select group of Club members made the trip across the Irish Sea to take part in the British Championships, with the Saturday sprint taking place in Armagh City and the middle-distance at Drumkeeragh Wood.



The sprint consisted of a qualifier and a final, although for several courses due to low numbers, all runners ran in the final.

As can be seen from the map, the area provided a good, complex area for sprint orienteering with plenty of route choice. In
