

The Compass Sport Cup is the British Clubs Orienteering Championships started by CompassSport Founder Ned Paul in 1982. Clubs are categorised into small (Trophy - 13 scorers - started in 1988) and large (Cup - 25 scorers) clubs. The Competition consists of an initial round in Spring and a Final round in the autumn. Prizes are provided for by CompassSport. The Competition is administrated by a volunteer co-ordinator on behalf of CompassSport and the Orienteering Clubs of the UK for which the competition was set up to serve.

You have, hopefully, already received an email about this but just in case not, and as a reminder to let Alan know asap if you want to take part, here is the information from Jon's email again:

Back in March, an intrepid group of WCOC members journeyed to Beanley in Northumberland where they competed and won the North East CompassSport Cup heat (by a good margin). This has gained the Club entry to the CompassSport Cup Final, which this year is being held on 12th November at New Beechenhurst in the Forest of Dean, organised by BOK. This is a really good area and one that is worth travelling to. WCOC normally subsidises a proportion of the cost.

place in Sutton Park, near Sutton Coldfield at the weekend, and special congratulations to the WCOC juniors, Daisy Rennie, Isaac Hunter, Dan Heppell and Ruben Razzetti, who helped England to a convincing win over Scotland.

In the individual races, Isaac was 3rd on M16, Daisy was 4th on W18, and Dan and Ruben were 4th, and 5th on M18. At the end of the first day, England held a narrow 5-point lead over Scotland, so there was all to play for going into the relays.



It is fair to say that England dominated the relays; in the women's race, England finished 1,2,3 and in the men's 1,3 and 4. Daisy had a great run on final leg to bring the England women's 3rd team back in 2nd place. Isaac had a solid run on 1st leg for Eng 2, coming back in 4th, but only seconds behind the runners in 2nd and 3rd, and his team eventually finished in 3rd. Ruben was last leg for

Eng 4, gaining places to bring the team home in 4th, and Dan ran last leg for Eng 3, the team finishing in 7th - an impressive set of results!

England won both days, and finished with an emphatic victory, with a total of 135 points, with Scotland 2nd with 118, Ireland 3rd with 65 and Wales 4th with 33.

Well done everyone on a great team performance and special congratulations to Isaac and Dan on their England debuts.


