

<u>Night Series Events</u> - Thanks to Pete Nelson for the most recent night event at Hunter How - sounds like it was a touch muddy! On a serious point Pete has put a poll on FB to gauge whether people would prefer to put up with a bit of mud for more technical terrain, or whether most people would prefer to avoid the mud. Of course what this highlights is the challenges faced by planners when the terrain in areas can vary considerably depending on the prevailing weather, and in trying to meet the varying levels of difficulty preferred by different orienteers. It sounds as though the event may inadvertently have provided great training for the muddy conditions encountered at the Compassport Cup!

On the 4.2km Long course Jamie Rennie obviously relished the mud to take the win in 33:36; with Toby Heppell 2nd in 35:26 and Daisy Rennie 3rd (1st lady) in 40:18. The rest of the top ten was made up of Steve Holmes 4th, Robert Simpson 5th, David Spencer6th, Jacob Tonkin 7th, Andrew Bradley 8th, Matt Stephens 9th, and Steve Breeze 10th. Second lady was Emma Graham, and Kate Charles was 3rd.

On the 2km Short course Sophie Crawford took the win in 28:49, Roger Jackson was 2nd 30:08, and Kevin Hodgson and Sue Skinner were joint 3rd in 30:20. The rest of the top ten was made up of Lynne Thomas 5th, Bob Barnby 6th, Jim Morris 7th, Adele Newal (KERNO) 8th, Richard Cummings 9th and Deborah Goodwin 10th.

On the yellow course, Sola Holmes was 1st and Sam Morris 2nd.

Entries are open for next year's event which takes place over the weekend of 26th - 28th January.


