The rest of the top ten was made up of Phil Winskill 4th, Jamie Rennie 5th, Ben Breeze 6th, Isaac Hunter 7th, Sophie Crawford 8th (2nd lady), Steve Holmes 9th and Stuart Crawford 10th. Eva Humphreys was 3rd lady.

On the 3.15km Short course, not to be outdone by brother Dan, Toby Heppell took an emphatic win in 16:35, George Rennie was 2nd in 21:29, and Helen Hargreaves was 3rd (1st lady) in 21:38. The rest of the top ten was made up of Martin Skinner 4th, Roger Thomas 5th, Howard Leslie 6th, Sue Skinner 7th (2nd lady), Patrick Gorrill 8th, Ian Teasdale 9th and Isabel Winskill 10th (3rd lady), and on the 1.4km Easy course, Freya Rowland took the win, with Bea Gorrill 2nd, Remy Hutton 3rd, Cerys Naylor 4th, Rob Stein 5th and Stefie Stein 6th (sure you can take your dad next time Stefie!).
